## CHURCH VAN OPPORTUNITY

The Service/Mission team is seeking the support of the congregation for the purchase of a van for church wide use. We have less drivers for our commercial busses, so a van would be convenient for additional drivers to operate in all travel needs. A van would also be more accessible for Life Groups, youth small groups, work projects, and adult retreats. Our current bus is reaching 30 years of age and lacks many of the features that a van would provide.

We are seeking a Ford Transit van with 75,000-100,000 miles that holds 14 passengers. It would be a mid to tall model. This type van drives well, great visibility, and is easy to enter and exit for all ages. The cost for this will be \$35,000-\$45,000. We currently have approximately \$5,000. We are asking for all to prayerfully consider supporting this financially. This purchase will aid in ministry for many years to come just as our busses have done for years past. Our team is seeking to secure the funding prior to bringing a recommendation to consistory for final approval and purchase. 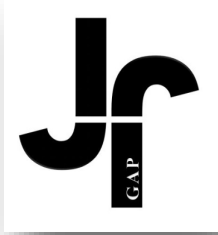

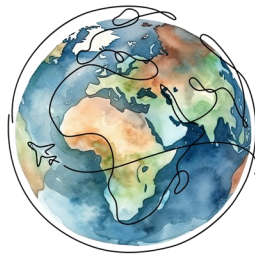

**Sr. High Summer Mission Trip - June 21-29, 2024** - We are excited to announce that our location for the Sr. High summer mission trip will be **Whitesburg, Kentucky**. Whitesburg is a small town of nearly 1,700 people in the valley of the North Fork of the Kentucky River, surrounded by mountains. Due to the decline of the coal industry over the years, almost 25% of families live under the poverty line. While in Whitesburg, we will stay at First Baptist Church. We will have the opportunity to serve in a variety of ways including physical labor, construction, and ministering to children and youth.

This community was on national news two summers ago as flooding caused large amounts of destruction and loss. We will help with their rebuilding efforts. ## Special Offering Opportunity for March & April The Gospel Mission of Sioux City

The Gospel Mission exists to feed the hungry, clothe the poor, shelter the homeless, to lead them to Christ.



The Mission has served 3 meals a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year for 85 years. Our Mission Kitchen serves hot meals to our shelter residents, and in addition serves meals to other homeless individuals and community members who are in need. The only requirement is that they pass a breathalyzer test. Our Food pantry regularly serves 50+ family units each day, where they can pick out a variety of food items, including canned foods, fresh produce and baked goods. Both the community meal program and food pantry are supported through in-kind donations of food, as well as food purchased through local vendors. We've recently started a relationship with the Food Bank of Siouxland to purchase low-cost food items for both our kitchen and our Pantry.

Our second-hand Thrift stores receive donations of used clothing, furniture and housewares, and sell them in our two stores located adjacent to the Mission and in a South Sioux City NE location. Excess or substandard clothing is baled for sale to a wholesaler for distribution to other retail outlets and ministries, avoiding taking up space in our local landfills.

The Mission has three shelter buildings, all close by to our main location at 500 Bluff St. in Sioux City. Our Women's/Children shelter is able to house 40 women/children. Many of these women find themselves in difficult situations due to abuse or abandonment. We work with these women and children to get them back on their feet and into permanent housing and support settings. Our Men's/children shelter houses 4 families who need support and encouragement during their search for permanent housing. Our men's shelter houses 75 individuals who find themselves out of work, out of housing, or in need of physical, emotional, and spiritual support due to addictions or mental health issues. All residents of the shelters breathalyze twice daily.

While the part about "leading them to Christ" is the last piece of our mission statement, it is our primary goal for all parts of our daily operations. We offer 2 chapel/devotion times each day, and require all residents to attend at least one session each day. Our women shelter residents regularly attend a local church. We hire only staff who can attest to our Statement of Christian Faith and Biblical definition of Marriage and Sexuality agreement. I've personally seen our staff reach out purposefully to mentor residents 1:1. Relationships are so very important to helping someone see their need for a Saviour!
