- The meeting was paused to have a word of prayer for a congregational member that was having a medical emergency at that time.
- Moved to the financial portion of the meeting. It was explained how the Thanksgiving offering was designated and dispersed.

- Pastor Jeremy explained to the deacons what the elders have decided about which version of pew bibles we will be getting for the church, which will be put in the pews and given to the children so that they are all the same. We will be going to the ESV because we think this is the more conservative version and closest version to what we are used to.

They are looking into installing a handrail for help with getting on the stage.

  - Discipleship - still searching for a Youth Director. Traveling Nativity went well. A big thank you to the Nativity planning team and a big thank you to volunteers that helped out.

  - M/S/C to adjourn after prayer by Pastor Jeremy

# Anna Mae Van Ommeren

December 5, 1939 - December 11, 2025

**Mrs. Anna Mae was born on December 5, 1939, on a farm south of Rock Valley, one of nine children born to Thomas William and Edith Ruth (Vander Bok) Vanden Bosch. Her parents moved to Wisconsin and Minnesota, before returning to Iowa, where Anna Mae was a student at Western Christian High School in Hull before the family moved to Everett Washington, where she graduated from the Everett High School.**

**On June 6, 1958, she was united in marriage to her high school sweetheart, Stanley James Van Ommeren, who had also moved to Washington in order to be close to Anna Mae. Together they made their home in Everett for several years until returning to Northwest Iowa in the early 1960's, settling in Maurice. While her children were young, Anna Mae worked part-time as a door-to-door salesperson for Avon and collected eggs at Bergsma's Cackleberry Farm, near Maurice. She later worked at K-Products in Orange City and eventually became a Certified Nursing Assistant. She briefly worked at the long-term care facility in Sioux Center before starting at the Heritage House Nursing Home in Orange City, where she later transitioned to cooking in the kitchen. She found joy in her work and in helping others. She retired at the age of 62 but continued to work part-time when she and Stan were not traveling.**

**Anna Mae was a member of the Maurice Reformed Church, where she had become a regular contributor to the church's Stitches of Love group. Anna Mae's spiritual journey consisted of reading the bible daily with Stan, and she was a silent prayer warrior. She liked to spend her free time sewing, crocheting and knitting, gardening, reading, playing games, and doing puzzles. She enjoyed traveling with Stan, and they looked forward to their family vacations to the state of Washington; Round Lake, Minnesota; and Lake Andes, South Dakota. In earlier years, Anna Mae and Stan were able to ride motorcycle to all of the lower 48 states, and in later years, they drove their motorhome to Arizona and Texas, where Anna Mae loved to spend time by the ocean.**

**She will be dearly missed by her husband of more than 67 years, Stan. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her husband's parents, Peter and Priscilla Van Ommeren; a brother, Aldred "Bud" (Arlene and Jeanie) Vanden Bosch; a sister, Elvina (Allen) Meerbeek; and three brothers-in-law, Clarence Van Beek; Donald (Marjorie) Van Ommeren; and Dennis Van Ommeren.**

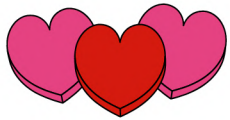

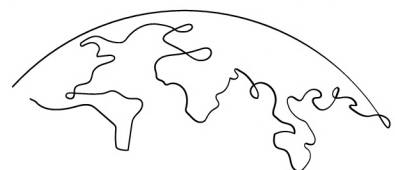

Brian is an RCA missionary who has been involved in Bible translation since 1989. Since 1996 Brian has worked with the United Bible Societies, giving support to national translators and consultants. He works with translation teams to help them understand the process of translation as well as giving them resources to achieve a high level of quality and consistency which includes teaching them to use new computer programs for translation. Brian participates in training events from Thailand to South Africa, Central Africa, and many places in between. In this process he has worked with over 300 translators. It is the hope that with training translators, they can go back and lead training events in their own areas, some of which are closed for Brian to travel into.
