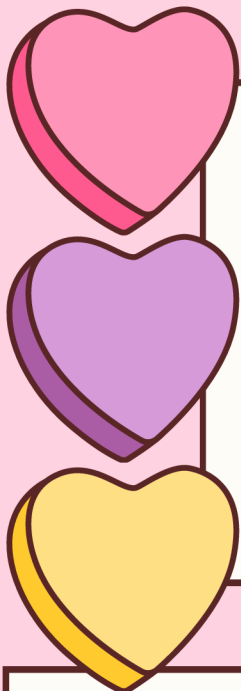

## Pinewood Derby February 11

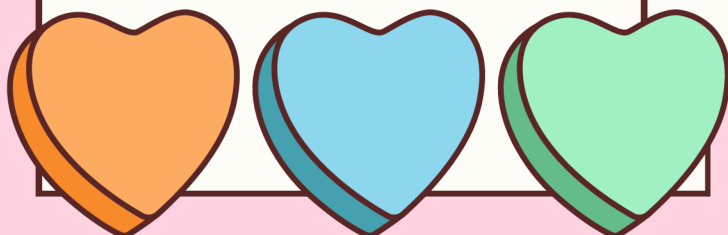

## CONSISTORY MEETING NOTES JANUARY 12, 2026

- Pastor Jeremy and Steve Vis had another meeting with the Kingdom Network Leadership Cohort and gave an update. We are to tell people what we see in them. We are to encourage others and multiply leaders intentionally.
- Consistory then moved to Core Value #4. Our spiritual gifts and what they are and how we use them at MRC. We as a consistory should be using our spiritual gifts and showing the congregation and others why and how we are using our gifts and encourage others to use theirs.

## Meet Our Mission Partners: Tom Johnson

Tom shared in his December newsletter: "In the past two months, I have received 15 applications from overseas candidates (all affiliated with RCA churches/partners) with another three likely to come from Young Life staff in West Africa. It's been four years since I started this online training ministry through the Coram Deo framework, and it's only in the past few months that others have taken notice of what we're offering. This comes at the most ideal time, and managing this large number will keep my days quite full.

As Scripture teaches, the Lord's time is always best.

The largest group of commissioned pastor candidates is associated with the Evangelical Orthodox Church of Congo and several Canadian RCA churches. These candidates are already serving as pastors, despite their lack of training. They live in a conflict zone around Bukavu, Congo, where it has been very difficult for them to organize training or even for formal Bible schools to function. We will attempt to deliver our content through the WhatsApp software, which allows audio, video, and file sharing, as well as communications. There's still a question of whether their internet is robust enough and whether these pastors can get access to computers for their studies, as it is difficult to deliver entire interactive courses (with reading and written responses) through cellphones.

So, we still need to work out some of the details before beginning."

## PRAYERS AND PRAISES

- We thank God for the multitude of pastoral studies candidates! Now we need prayer to help them onboard and to navigate a difficult technological reality of providing courses to African pastors, currently without computers and only having phone internet in a recent war zone! Pray for God to work out these and other details!
- We're thankful for Laurey and Ian's engagement, and we lift them up in prayer, while we ask for the Lord's guidance in planning for their July 2026 wedding.
- Pray for safe travels as the older girls come home for the holidays, with two international trips scheduled for spring 2026.
- We ask the Lord to provide for the new French pastoral candidates' training costs and for my ministry support. I have less than 2/3 of my needed support going into 2026, as many supporting churches have reduced their giving post-COVID, while others have changed their mission priorities. Please let me know if you are aware of potential individual or church partners for this growing ministry
