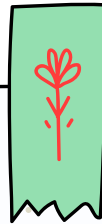

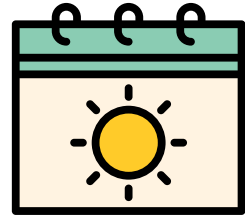

SUPPER AT VBS

- Meals are available for students and volunteers each night in the Family Life Center. Serving times are from 5:15-6:00 PM each night.

ARRIVAL, DROP OFF, & PICK UP

- Students need to be here by 6:00 PM each night, if not eating here.

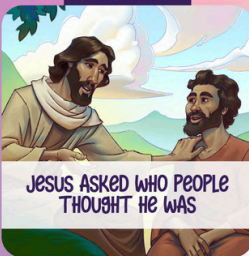

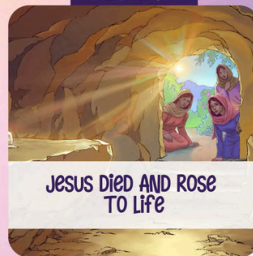

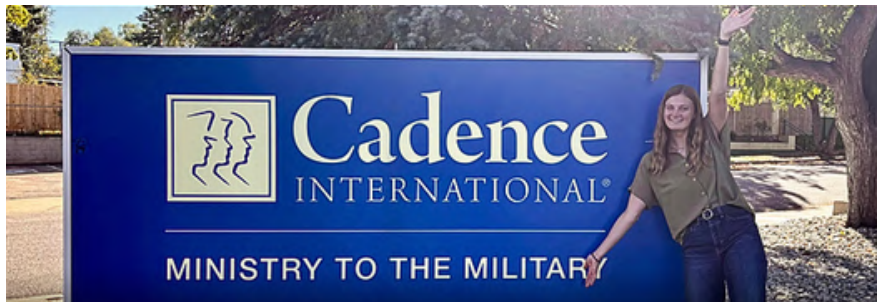
